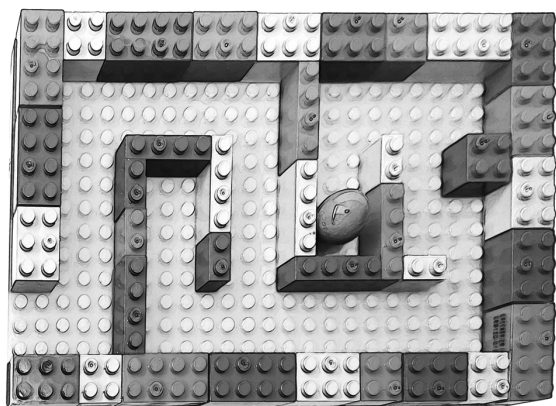


E. Marble Maze

1. Use plastic blocks to build a maze.
2. Tilt the maze to move the marble to the end of the maze.
3. The fastest player wins the game.

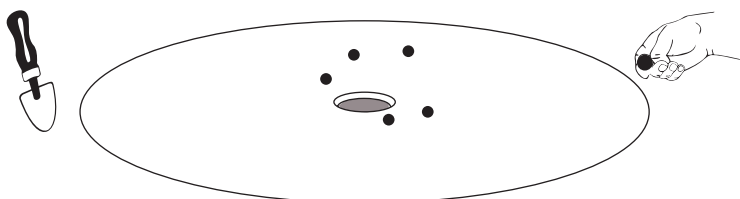
How To Play Marbles



WARNING: Marbles are a choking hazard. Keep away from very young children who may put marbles in their mouth.

C. Cherry Pit Marbles

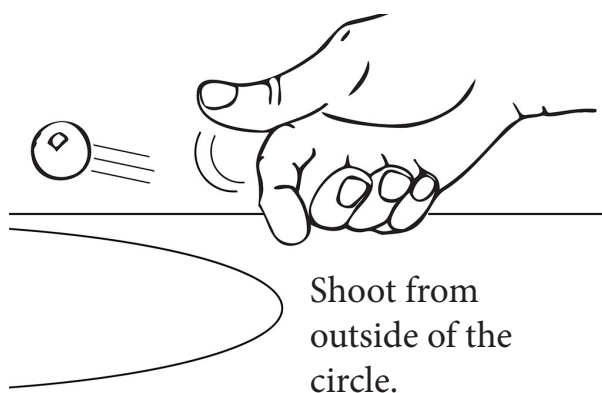
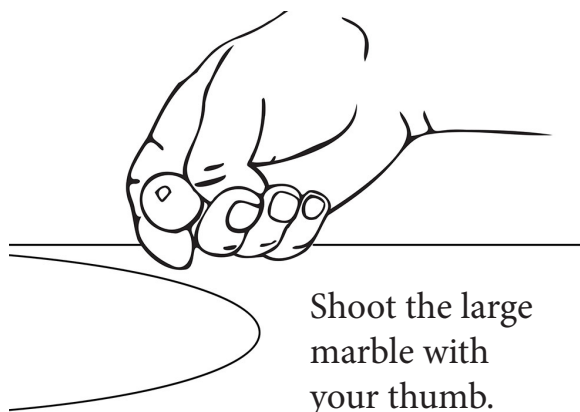
1. Draw a circle between 1 and 3 meters wide.
2. Dig a small hole in the middle of the circle.



3. Take turns shooting marbles.
4. The player who comes closest to the hole without falling in wins the game.

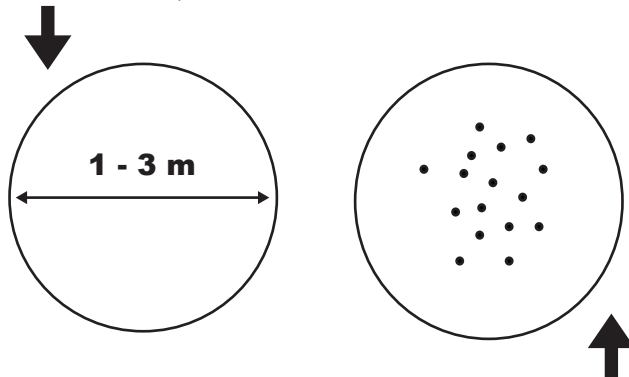
—OR—

4. Score 1 point each time you knock another player's marble into the hole.
5. Player with the most points wins.



A. Traditional Marbles

1. Draw a circle between 1 and 3 meters wide.
(Use chalk or just draw with a stick in the dirt.)



2. Place 12 or more small marbles in the circle.
(You can just drop them in a random group or you can place them in an “X” pattern.)

3. Take turns using the large “shooter” marble to knock the smaller marbles out of the circle. →

4. Players who knock a marble out of the circle get 1 point and can pick up their shooter. When it is their turn again, they can shoot from anywhere outside of the circle.

5. Players who do NOT knock a marble out of the circle do not get a point and must leave their shooter where it lands. When it is their turn again, they must shoot from wherever the shooter landed.

6. The game continues until all the small marbles have been knocked out of the circle.

7. The player who knocked the most marbles out wins.

- For a longer game, draw a larger circle and start with more marbles.
- For a shorter game, draw a smaller circle and start with fewer marbles.

D. Mini Golf Marbles

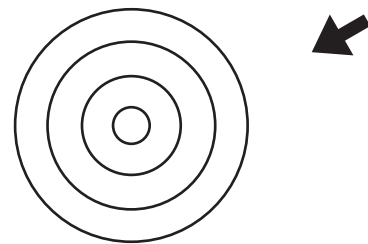
1. Decide how many holes you want your miniature golf course to have.
2. Dig small holes several meters apart. (If you can't dig holes, use a cup on its side instead.)
3. You can add obstacles to your golf course like rocks to go around or an arch to go through.



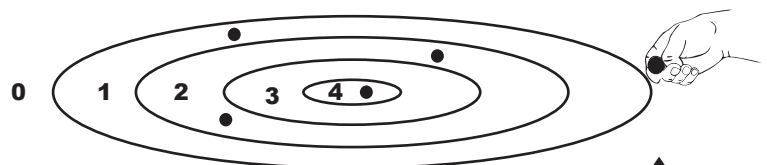
4. Shoot your marble from the beginning of the golf course. Shoot again from wherever it lands. Continue shooting until your marble goes into the hole.
5. Count how many shots it takes to get your marble into the hole.
6. The player with the fewest shots wins.

B. Bullseye Marbles

1. Draw a circle between 1 and 3 meters wide.
2. Draw 3 more circles to make a target.



3. Each player shoots 5 marbles from the outside of the circle.



4. Each marble earns 0, 1, 2, 3, or 4 points as shown above.
5. Add the scores for a player's five marbles.
6. The player with the highest score wins.
